

gulfed. **Roll over**



A joint funeral service for former Acton resident Lori Swackhamer and her husband, Troy Hunter, was held on Monday at Presbyterian Knox Church.

The newlyweds, from Collingwood, were killed in a "pretty horrific" headon crash south of Alliston on Christmas Day.

Dufferin-Wellington OPP Constable Al Buck said Swackhamer's 2001 Ford Focus was southbound on Airport Road when it crossed the centre line and spun into an oncoming northbound Chrysler, driven by a St. Catharines man, who along with his wife, was taken to hospital with nonlife threatening injuries.
