One of the keys of the game was that the Tanners were able to stay out of the penalty box all night while going two for four on the power play.

Lone setback

The Tanners' lone setback

over the five games occurred in Burlington two days earlier when they lost 8-3. The Tanners actually led the contest 3-1 with only just over two minutes left in the second period but the combination of playing a tough match the night before in Hespeler and playing with only 11 skaters was too much for the Tanners against a

much larger Burlington side whose strategy appeared to be to simply wear their visitors down.

Despite the score, Dirk Vansoelen made several big saves in goal early on, which helped keep the score close until the home side took control against the tired Tanners in the third period. Woolford scored twice while Hofland

picked up the other Tanner goal.

The Tanners began their five games in six nights run with a hard fought 2-2 tie in Hespeler. Again playing with a depleted bench due to illness and suspension the Tanners fought gamely and took a 2-0 advantage into the third period. However, the home side was able to score

twice in the final six minutes to earn the tie.

Woolford and Kri scored for the Tanners with Creasey again the leading playmaker, picking up two assists. Bennett was again superb on defence handing out body checks, the quality of which has not been seen since Brian Glennie patrolled the blue line for

the Maple Leafs decades ago. Warren, who was 2-0-1 during the five-game run for the Tanners, saved 18 out of 20 shots and was particularly sharp early on when Hespeler jumped out to a 9-0- shot advantage.

The Tanners have two games remaining in their regular season, which finishes January 5.

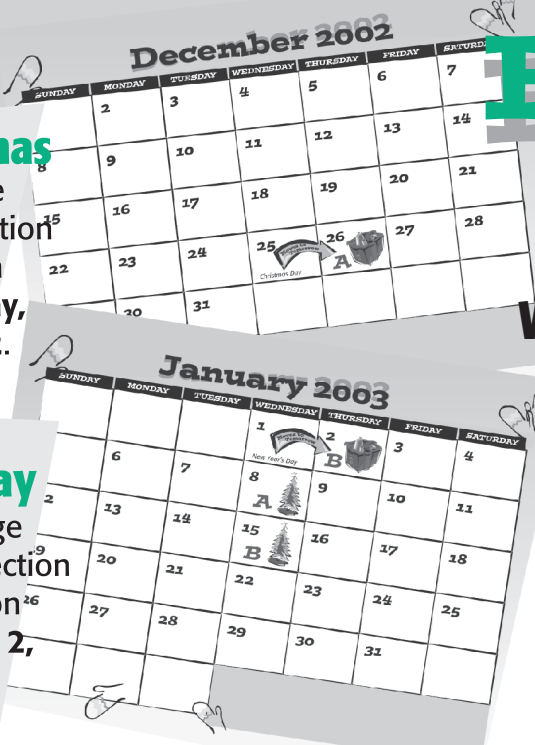

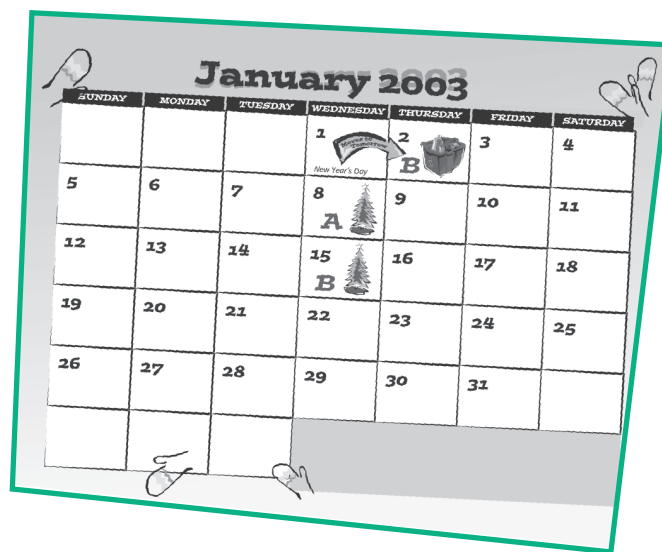
