When is a library not a library?

In the past the word library often brought to mind a place where all were to be quiet and talk in hushed tones and a stone-faced librarian constantly spraying the occupants with "sh", "sh", "sh". Libraries have changed over the years and none have changed more than the school libraries

Not too long ago a school library consisted of a shelf of books in the back of the classroom. If a school was fortunate enough to have a room for the library, often no one was available to look after it. Teachers were able to take their class for weekly book exchange, locking the library door after they were finished. Now most schools have a library area and a teacher-librarian to bring children and learning materials together.

The shelf of books has grown into specialized collections of not only books but records, cassettes, filmstrips, videos, and computer programs, picked to support the curriculum of the school. The teachers depend on these materials for classroom program support.

The library at E. W. Foster is bright and cheerful. It is rarely silent. There is continual hum of activity. Children come and go changing books everyday if they wish. They participate in activities worked out by their teacher and the teacher-librarian. Throughout the day children from all different grade levels work in the library using the listening and viewing centers, reference materials and computers. One of the best




