

# Visitors come for day study shows Entertainment

Initial results of the Halton Tourism Study show the average visitor to the region is more than 25 years old, has an above-average income, and travels with a group of two-to-four people on a day trip.

These results come from interviews with 572 summer visitors to various parts of the region during the summer. The findings will be used to help Halton promote the kinds of attractions which will encourage more visitors to Milton and other areas of the region.

The interviews show there seems to be a major difference between the marketing areas of north and south Halton. About 75 per cent of those people visiting Milton and Halton Hills live within an hour's drive and come from Peel, south Halton, and Metro Toronto.

Most people visit for a single purpose like visiting the Kelo Conservation Area or they shop at the Old Hide House. Only 10-20 per cent stay overnight or longer, thus generating tourist revenues of about

\$20-\$30 each per visit. In the south, visitors come from outside the country as well as from several other provinces. The average tourist revenue is between \$82-\$95 and upwards of 40 per cent stay overnight or longer.

Downtown Oakville and Burlington have the highest level of visits and awareness among tourists. Georgetown comes third. The best known tourists spots in Halton are Glen Abbey and the Royal Botanical Garden.

### Microwaves solve leftover dilemma


Leftovers are not usually a favourite meal time but they can be.
