# Juniors in form

It was a win at the expense of a winless basketball team, but junior Mustang coach Peter Roser called it a turning point. His cagers beat Loyola (0-5) 49-36 Friday at Milton district high school.

"That's more like it, isn't it?" he asked rhetorically after the final buzzer. The point was made that Loyola is not exactly a Halton powerhouse.

"No doubt about it," he admitted. "But we also played more of the type of game we wanted to play. That's with scoring, with defence, with everything. And the second half was probably our best half of the year."

Loyola fashioned the narrowest of leads (17-16) going into the second half but Milton came on to tie it at 20 early in the third. They widened the lead throughout the remainder of the game, ending the third with the visitors trapped behind a 32-21 deficit.

But it was a spirited effort on Loyola's part. The winless squad carries three midget players. It is the first year they have produced a junior team. The school is only two years old and offers grades nine 9-11.

Greg Holderoff was the leading Milton scorer with 14 points and Bill Corradetti added 12. Shawn Greene had seven for the visitors and Sean Clayford added six.

Milton plays next on Feb. 6 when they will face Blakelock Tabbies in Oakville.

Senior

They may not be kings of the hill, but they've taken a round out of the kings.

Milton District High School senior Mustangs played their best basketball of the year, according to coach Regan Heffernan, to upset Oakville Trafalgar 38-30 in Oakville Wednesday. The result dropped league-leading Oakville into third place and gave Milton second spot. Milton shares that berth with T.A. Blakelock Tabbies, Oakville's Queen Elizabeth Park holds down the top east Halton place now.

In other recent action, Milton downed Acton 34-30. But it was the Oakville game that Heffernan wanted to talk about.

"Knocking off the first-place club has left these kids incredibly pumped up," he said. "We really played well. We always had a two to four point lead. We also played five different types of defence."

"They had a 6'4" kid at centre but we controlled him, Heffernan continued. "Everything we did we did better and tougher than they did."

"Finley McCallum scored eight points on their big kid and he only scored two on Finley," Heffernan pointed out. "And that's despite the fact that our guy gave away three inches and 20 pounds."

Heffernan also singled out Glen South's

shifts for special praise. "He played a fantastic game. He made at least 10 key defensive plays."

Mustangs take a couple of weeks off for the examination break before swinging back into action Feb. 6 against Blakelock in Oakville. Both squads sport seven wins against three losses but Blakelock has beaten Milton in their only encounter.

"If we beat them we'll be alone in second," Heffernan pointed out. "If we finish second we play the third-place team from the west (Halton division, in playoffs). If we finish third we've got to play the second-place team."

Midget

A little more inspiration would be nice, but a lot more perspiration is almost guaranteed in order to make Milton's midget basketball team play better.

"We've got to work on defence, particularly zone defence. We're allowing too much. We'll be stressing the work ethic a bit more," warned Mustang coach Bob Neshevich Friday. The scolding came following Milton's 56-51 loss to Loyola of Oakville.

"We gave up too many points," Neshevich went on. "And we weren't too consistent in the shooting department. But their point guard (Ian Leid) was fantastic. He beat us on fast breaks and he didn't miss a lay up."

The loss dropped Milton's record to two and four. They are tied with Georgetown for

15th place in east Halton.

The loss was doubly frustrating, Neshevich because his cagers had come big in a tough tournament the previous weekend at Streetsville. There they earned a berth in the tournament final, were edged by Erindale 45-44.

"It was like night and day," Neshevich said.

Loyola coach Stan Gajewski was harsh on Milton. He said their effort Friday was surprisingly strong. "We didn't play well as we should have but Milton has proved greatly," he said. "The first time we beat them 48-36. Fairly handily. We had a second string in early. But tonight we had first string in all the time and we were trouble."

Craig Tattersall was Milton's leading scorer with 14 points, followed by Andrew Wilson with 12. Jandre Semrret scored 14. Loyola and Leid added 13 points.

Loyola led 27-21 at the half but Milton held back in the third quarter to hold a 30-27 lead at the period buzzer. Loyola pulled ahead on a Leid lay up early in the frame and they stayed there. The team were neck-and-neck until almost the last minute of play. Loyola made it 52-49 with bonus points at 1:15 remaining, scored basket from a scramble after a missed shot and added one more. Milton could counter once.

Mustangs are back in action Feb. 6 against Blakelock.
