Hawks beat leader

Two of the three Milton Hockey League games scheduled for Sunday were cancelled in deference to the Super Bowl and the weather, but the one which was played proved costly to Sandstone Transport.

The league leaders took a 7-3 pasting at the hands of Century 21 Golden Hawks. It was a bit of a comeuppance for Sandstone coach Derek Griffiths, who had predicted previously that his squad would face Straight Line Fence for the league championship.

Griffiths chastised his players as the game slipped away. He's not used to losing and it was obvious he thought his players had allowed themselves to be beaten.

On the other bench, new assistant coach Dave DeCaire made his presence felt, organizing a lot of the ice time. Both teams had to commit players to longer shifts as both sides enjoyed considerably less than full attendance for the game. Some of the people who were there looked like they had done some serious Super Bowl indulging before arriving.

In other developments, Straight Line Fence picked up a win by default. Super-choice Country Markets failed to notify the league in advance that they would not play Sunday, apparently since not everyone had

decided whether they would or not. Super-choice forfeited the game and two points.

Haggart Crane Service and West End Bulls cancelled formally for the scheduled third contest. At press time it was unclear whether that game would be re-scheduled.

Hawks looked sharp in the contest, played while sub-arctic winds and temperatures turned the Milton Sports Centre arena into a giant freezer. Hawks scored short-handed goals and controlled the majority of play to earn the victory.

Sandstone jumped to a 2-0 lead in the first period but Hawks countered with three goals to chug ahead in the middle act. They added four goals in the last period and Sandstone could only retaliate with one.

Mike Kalapaca, who has been on a scoring tear recently, led the Hawk offence with four goals. He scored the first three Hawk goals of the game to put his team in front.

Most of the goals in the game were scored from close range amid a tangle of players, as is so often the case in non-contact hockey.

Wayne Broughton, Ken Whetham and Duane Stark added the other Century 21 goals. Mark Mullaly added four assists for Golden Hawks.
