"It's a safety feature that's needed," said chairman of the buckle up baby committee, Jim Bell

The service club member explained parents may be unwilling to make the investment to buy a seat but if one is available for \$25 they could consider using it. When the love seats are returned \$10 of the rental fee is refunded


