

Just like old times

Sunday's Juvenile rep AA hockey game between Milton Home Hardware and Orangeville featured some of the worst elements that bracket of hockey can offer; too much fighting, too many penalties and a lot of useless complaining from the coaches. In the third period it also featured some of the better things Juvenile hockey can offer; some solid, smart and non-controversial play-making.

Orangeville took the tussle 3-1 amid cat-calls and controversy from both benches, mostly directed at the officials.

Once the game was over both the winning and the losing coaches were adamant in blaming the performance and its outcome on the two officials. Milton took 32 minutes in minors and Orangeville added 18 in the game. Both teams had two five-minute fighting penalties and Milton assistant coach George Cescon was thrown out of the game.

"We can't play hockey against seven guys (the other team and the officials)" groused Milton coach Jerry Lisi. "I take great pride in the hold I have on my guys. When this happens the guys get down. They try their very best and then this happens. And it's not that Orangeville is a better team. There is no way."

Orangeville coach Dennis Lever might not have agreed with Lisi's last statement but in other aspects they were in accord.

"I thought it was very poor refereeing, very inconsistent," he said. "As the game progressed you could see that they lost it." Prior to Sunday's contest Lever had five players suspended.

"We could have called a lot more," said one official after the game.

Orangeville's John Muirhead opened the scoring at 5:06 remaining of the first period. Orangeville maintained that lead until the final frame.

In the second period Orangeville broke up numerous Milton attacks at the defending blue line and threatened often, forcing numerous face-offs in the Milton zone. The game was a vapid exercise in the latter part of the second, bogged down with penalties and fighting as officials assigned penalty after penalty. The period ended with a wrestling match in the Milton crease.

Milton tied the game early in the third thanks to a Glen Houston goal. Houston powered in on a breakaway to beat Shawn Lauzon with a backhander.

But with 4:10 remaining Orangeville got

the winner on a power-play effort. Rick Delzotto converted a rebound. Thirty seconds later, Orangeville bought an insurance policy with a breakaway goal from Daryl Nodwell while the teams played even-handed.

Lisi is suspended for one game because his team took more than 30 minutes in penalties.

Milton has three games remaining in league play prior to playoffs. Saturday they have a return engagement with Orangeville at Orangeville and Sunday and Monday they play Streetsville. Lisi expects a minimum of two wins.

Lever, also planning for playoffs, warned that he would be much stronger in the near future, after he obtains Orangeville Jr.C cuts.

Phantoms-Kamis tie

The game had opened with Ian Hamer coming close twice for Kamis. Kamis netminder Greg Moulton stymied Arthur Harrison when he blocked Harrison's low shot to prevent Phantoms from widening their lead.

Kamis took three two-minute penalties in the contest but Phantoms failed to capitalize on any of them. The first came following Harrison's block while Nick Thomas sat in the sin bin. The second penalty came in the middle of the latter half. It proved costly. Again Phantoms failed to organize and they ended up conceding a penalty shot to the short-handed Kamis squad. Ian Hamer blasted home the spot kick to level the score.

Moulton juggled a free kick by Harrison but managed to keep it out of the net. In the last minute of play Phantoms got their last power-play chance but Kamis held on to preserve the tie.

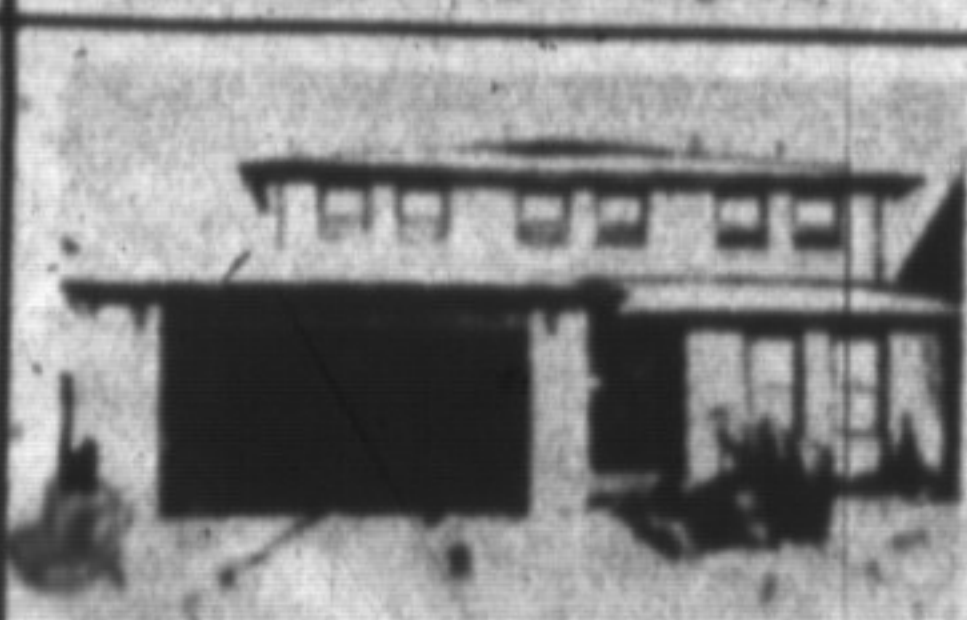

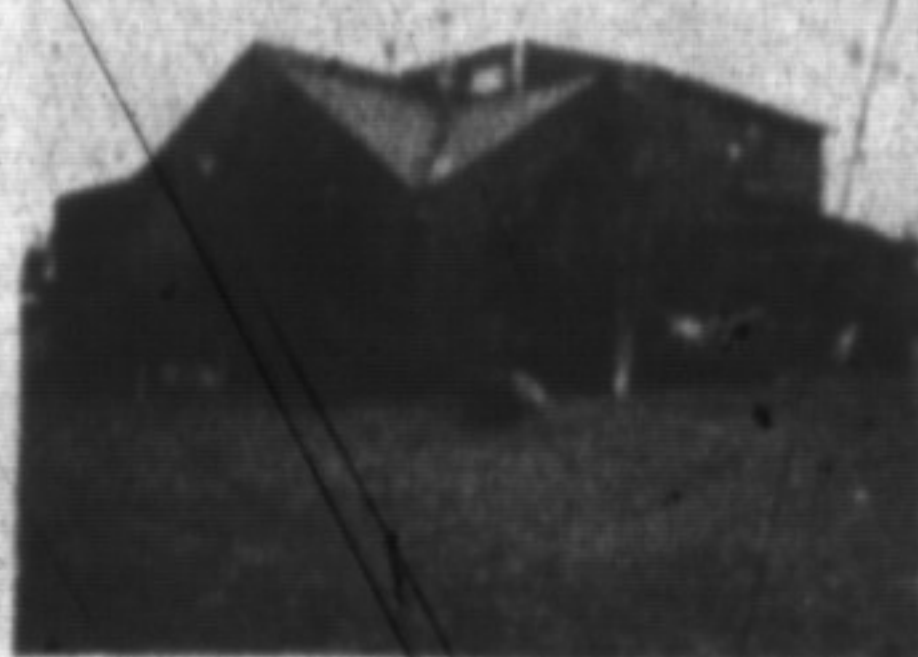
