The Bill was introduced on the 25th Feb. and is intended to entirely stuitify the M'Carthy Act. Strange to say this M'Carthy Act acknowledges the power of our Provincial government in this matter, agreeable to the 92 Sect. B. N. A. Act, and declares that any person, entitled to a license under the Dominion Act, must first shew a receipt of payment of fees levied by the Province, before the Ottawa license can issue.
