some of the fresh meat butchered in winter is not canned, as it may easily be. Cut it in small pieces without any bone, and cook so thoroughly as to expel all air. Then place it quickly in glass jars that have been slowly heated until they are nearly as hot as the cooked food. If this is done and the cans are immersed, except the tops, in hot water, the glass will not break. Pack the meat as closely as possible in the can, and when filled cover the top with melted lard and seal the can. The lard will protect the meat beneath it from any air that may be under the lid of the can and which may have ferment germs. A few cans of fresh meat for use in summer will be quite as convenient as the cans of fruit and vegetables which all good housewives now put up every summer and fall in greatest abundance. Fresh fruit in the summer is more easy to get in the country than is fresh meat of any kind.


