Coroner Bateman was at once notified, and after consulting with County Crown Attorney Farewell, decided to hold an inquest. A jury was at once empanelled and as we go to press the inquest is in progress. We understand that deceased had attended a Masonic meeting in Brougham that evening and was just returning home when death met him within a few yards of his own gate. He was an industrious farmer and a good citizen, and was for a time a member of the township council. By strict attention to business Mr. Westgate had accumulated considerable wealth, and leaves his sorrowing wife and children fairly well provided with this world's goods. He was a member of the A.O.U.W., C. O. F., and A. F. & A. M. orders. The bereaved widow and family have much sympathy in their very sad trial and affliction.—News.

STOUFFVILLE.
