A Sad Accident

One of the saddest accidents we have heard of for some time, and one by which a promising young man of 22 years of age may lose his life, occurred Tuesday on the farm of Jas. Dr. Bascom was sent for, and it is all that is possible to relieve the intense pain. It is probable that his injuries will in the end prove fatal, although he may linger some months.
