Indigent accounts passed: A Orvis, services as commissioner, \$6.35; Toronto General Hospital, \$114.80; Samuel Pennock, coffin and attending funeral of Henry Elson, \$6; Joram Littlejohn, digging grave for Henry Elson, \$2; Dr U E Bateson, medical attendance, \$9; Joseph Burk, support and care of Henry Elson, \$12; W Bengally, wood supplied M Ryan, \$4; W D Matthews, coal supplied R Gibson and teaming same, \$12; Charles Lynde be appointed commissioner re Mrs Proctor instead of A Orvis; Jas Hubbard be placed on the list of indigents at \$1.25, and that R J Price act as commissioner for same.
