Mr Ross gave notice that at the next assembling of the "City Fathers," he will introduce some legislation to remodel the road divisions at Mount Carmel.

The regular monthly meeting of the council for the Township of Whitby was held on Monday last when all the members were present.

Mr Ross, of the Western Road Machine Co., addressed the council as to the merits of their Machine.

On motion of Messrs Smith and Ketchen, the tender of Jessie Cook for corporation lumber was accepted at \$13 per thousand for pine and \$10.50 for cedar, free on board cars at Brooklin.

On motion of Messrs Willis and Smith a by-law was passed to borrow \$2,000, if required, for current expenses until the receipt of taxes.

Mr Fred Hatch, of Whitby, addressed the council re the purchase of sewer pipe, and, on motion of Messrs Smith and Willis, an order was given him for 180 feet of twelve inch at the same price as he sold at last year.

On motion of Messrs Smith and Ketchen, the clerk was instructed to cause notices to be placed in the different grave pits forbidding people from taking gravel or sand out of the pits without authority from the overseer of highways; also from digging holes for sand on the side of roads, thereby causing danger to the public.

On motion of Messrs Rogers and Willis these accounts were ordered to be paid: John Harris, work, \$2; Holidays Bros., goods to W Fox, \$13.88; Mrs Snider, board to Mrs Mills \$5.

The council adjourned until Monday May 21st, at 9 a.m., as a court of revision and for other business.
