"I have been accustomed to play in the band at the Exhibition, and last year, as the Exhibition time drew near, I was anxious to stick it out for that engagement, thinking it would be my last. I was beginning to feel the paralysis in my fingers, so that I could scarcely work the keys. My friends, too, thought it was all up with me."
"During the Exhibition I stayed with my daughter, who lives in Parkdale. I

Things We Ought to Know.

That fewer dishes will be broken if a small wooden tub is provided instead of the ordinary tin dishpan.

That all dish cloths and towel should be washed and scalded each day, and thoroughly dried before they are again used.

That a little borax or ammonia dissolved in the water in which silver is washed will keep the silver bright.

That silver should be thoroughly dried, then polished with chamois, if it is to retain its brightness.

That knives should be scoured regularly every time they are used.

That drops of water should never be allowed to dry on the steel blade of a knife, as the mark made is almost permanent.

That the flour barrel should be raised from the floor to prevent dampness.

That food should be kept hot for late comers by standing the dish in a pan of hot water, keeping the food closely covered with a lid.
