Delicate Desserts.

Creams to Temporarily Flagging Appetites, From Good Housekeeping.

Almond Charlotte russe, a dish fit for a king, requires a pint of thick sweet cream, white of an egg, a half ounce of gelatin, 2 tablespoonfuls of sugar, a teaspoonful of almond extract.

Bavarian Cream.—A pint of sweet milk, a half pint of hot water, a pint of whipped cream, 2 cupfuls of sugar, a teaspoonful extract of vanilla, a cupful of canned or fresh pineapple, a cupful of chopped English walnuts, a half boxful of gelatin.

White and Yellow.—Whites of 4 eggs, 4 tablespoonfuls of fine, white confectioners' sugar, 8 tablespoonfuls of currant jelly. Whip the whites of the eggs to a froth, then add the sugar and jelly, beat well together, put in small dishes ready to serve and pour around a custard made from the yolks of the eggs a cupful of milk and 2 tablespoonfuls of sugar.

Spanish cream.—Let a pint of milk, part cream, come to a boil and stir in the yolks of 3 eggs beaten to a cream with three fourths of a cupful of sugar. Let this come to a boil, then add half a box of gelatin which has soaked in a little milk for 15 minutes.
