> Cracks in Floors.—Weigh out a pound of flour and measure three quarts of water. Stir into the flour as much of the water as it is necessary to make a smooth paste. Add the remainder of the water and a tablespoonful of pulverized alum, mixing thoroughly. Tear newspapers into bits, putting as much as it will absorb into this paste, let it stand an hour then let it come to a boil, stirring until the pulp is of the consistency of putty. 
