Beach Council.

The regular meeting of Beach council was held on Monday Nov 8.

Communications were read from the Department of Agriculture, re road roads—submitting fifteen questions to the clerk of Beach, regarding the source of maintenance of roads of the municipality.

From Messrs Kerr, Macdonald, Davidson & Patterson, Barristers, re Toronto asking information regarding the Wire Fencing Bonus by-law of the municipality of Beach.

Mr Lamb reported that a culvert on the new road had collapsed. He had ordered its immediate reconstruction which had been accomplished at a small cost, the bill for the payment of which he expected would be presented at this meeting of council.

The following accounts were passed: \$150 to Mr Robt Swift for repairing three culverts on the Nonquon road; \$250 to Mr W Taylor being for work along, opposite lot 1, con 2; \$185 to Mr Joseph Baird for one days work and repairs on road machine; \$10 to Mr W H Hayes, being two-thirds loss sustained by him in having two of his ewes killed by dogs; \$2 to Mr Wm Medd, for 40 loads of gravel, and 25 cents to Mr E Duty for repairing culvert at Greenbank; \$125 to Mr Geo Johnston, for repairing bridge north of Uxco, con 5, Brock road; \$10 to Mr Mungo Weir, being amount due as provided for by bonus wire fence by-law, for erecting eighty rods of wire fence in front of his property near Prince Albert; \$3.40 to Mr P A Parrott for furnishing material and erecting a railing opposite lot 1, con 2; \$4 to Mr M Weir, and \$3.33 to Mr John Heard, being two thirds loss sustained by them, each having had a ewe killed by dogs.

The reeve and Mr McDonald were appointed a committee to examine the road opposite lot opposite lot 18, con 12, and are empowered to make any improvements in said road they may deem desirable.

The reeve and Mr McDonald were appointed to arrange with Mr J Malton for right of way to gravel pit on lot 13, con 14.

It was resolved that when the council adjourned it stand adjourned till the 15th of December, then to meet in compliance with the statute.

A by law was passed re-appointing the deputy returning officer of 1896 for the present year.

Mr Thos Beare came before the council. He complained that the great and steady stream of traffic in his locality was having its effect on the roads and bridges. The terminus of this extraordinary traffic seemed to be opposite his residence where large numbers frequently congregated; the object of these frequent night meetings it was not for him to surmise, but he did decidedly object to the language used at them during discussions, and his object in appearing before the council was to ascertain if such unseemly conduct cannot be suppressed.
