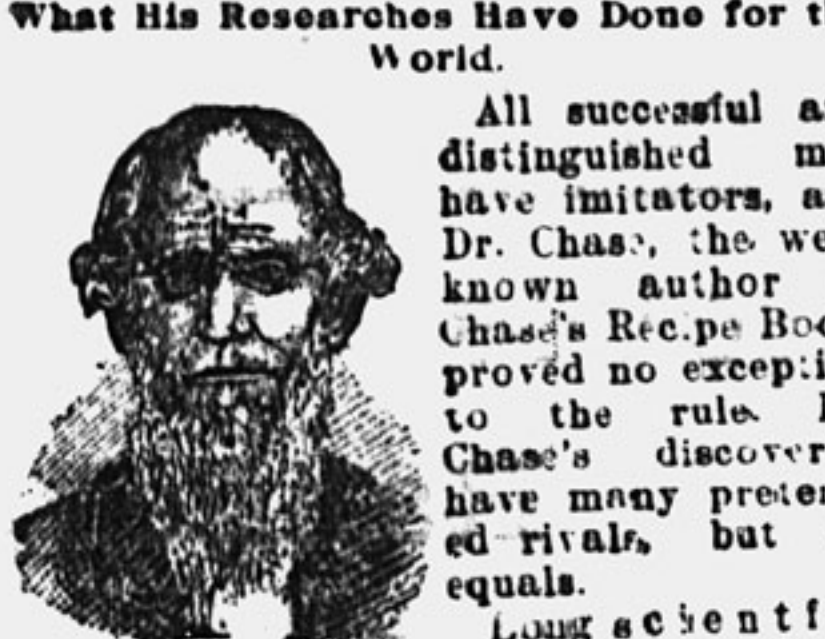

With the members all present, save Mr E T Williams, and with Reeve Vrooman in the chair, the municipal council of the township of Brock held a session on Saturday 18th inst., at the town hall, Sunderland.

Minutes of last meeting read and on motion adopted, accounts and communications read and laid on the table. Mr John T Edwards, commissioner for town line of Thorah and Brock reported as follows: Balance due from Brock for 1896, \$89 12; 71 days of statute labor at 75 cents per day, \$53.25; Cash expenditures, \$24 21 total \$116.05.

On motion of Mr Turner and Mr Edwards, the following accounts were passed and ordered to be paid, Wm Preston \$8 60 for gravel, Adam Shier \$8.88, two thirds, value of a sheep killed by dogs, Mathew McDonald \$8, he being charged in error for a dog and a bitch, John C Bott \$8.80 being a rebate on school taxes - in which an error occurred.

On motion of Mr Wetheral and Mr Turner the following accounts were passed and ordered to be paid, Samuel St John \$8, 50 for gravel; Thomas Moore, \$6 45 he being assessed in U S S No 20 Brock and Mariposa instead of U S S No 2 Brock and Beach; W H Taylor \$7.65 for 158 loads of gravel supplied the township; Richard Edwards \$2 50 for fifty loads of gravel; Wm Huskin \$8 for 60 loads of gravel.

On motion of Mr Edwards and Mr Turner, the following accounts were paid: Edward Acton \$1 85 for 87 loads of gravel; John Brandon, \$2 two thirds value of a sheep killed by dogs; H Baldwin \$6 50 in full of account to date; Thos Ewart \$6 for gravel on sidewalk, lot 18 and 19, not 11, and repairing culvert on Centre Road, con 10; W J Gibbs, \$6.80 for 124 loads of gravel.
