

# St. John's Vestry Meeting Hears Many Fine Reports

The Annual Vestry Meeting of St. John's Anglican Church was held in the Parish Hall on Monday evening, January 25, at 8:00 p.m.

The Rector, the Rev. A. C. Herbert, opened the meeting with the lesson of the day, and prayer for the deliberations and guidance on the business at hand.

**Population Growing**  
The incumbent's report pointed up the advancement in the whole church in this Parish of Darlington in that our general church population continues to increase gradually. The growth of the town and surrounding township presents a great potential for growth in the Parish.

**Expresses His Thanks**  
The Rector expressed his thanks to each organization and the Wardens, for their assistance and fellowship, and for their financial donations toward the new heating system and renovation of the Parish Hall. He was looking forward with eagerness to Parochial Mission to be held early in Lent, March 11 to 18. This Mission to be under the leadership of the Rev. Maurice P. Poole, of All Saints' Church, Peterboro. (The last mission to be held in this Parish was in Holy Week, 1929, and directed by the late Bishop of the Arctic, Dr. A. L. Fleming, assisted by Bishop Wilkinson, as Rev. F. H. Wilkinson. Rev. C. P. Muirhead was rector but was on leave of absence due to a serious illness.)

**Warden's Report**

The Warden's account showed \$8810.31 had been received in the current, and \$2365.39 in savings accounts. The Mission account totalled \$2086.14. \$750.00 had been paid Church Extension and \$1273.00 to Diocesan allotment.

Total receipts 1959, \$1621.40. All obligations were met.

Members attended the Deacony meeting in September. The Board meeting at the Anglican Centre in October and the W.A. Annual in May. They held their annual spring tea and sale of work in May. All pledges met in full.
