\$1,502 Stolen From Garton's Bus Station

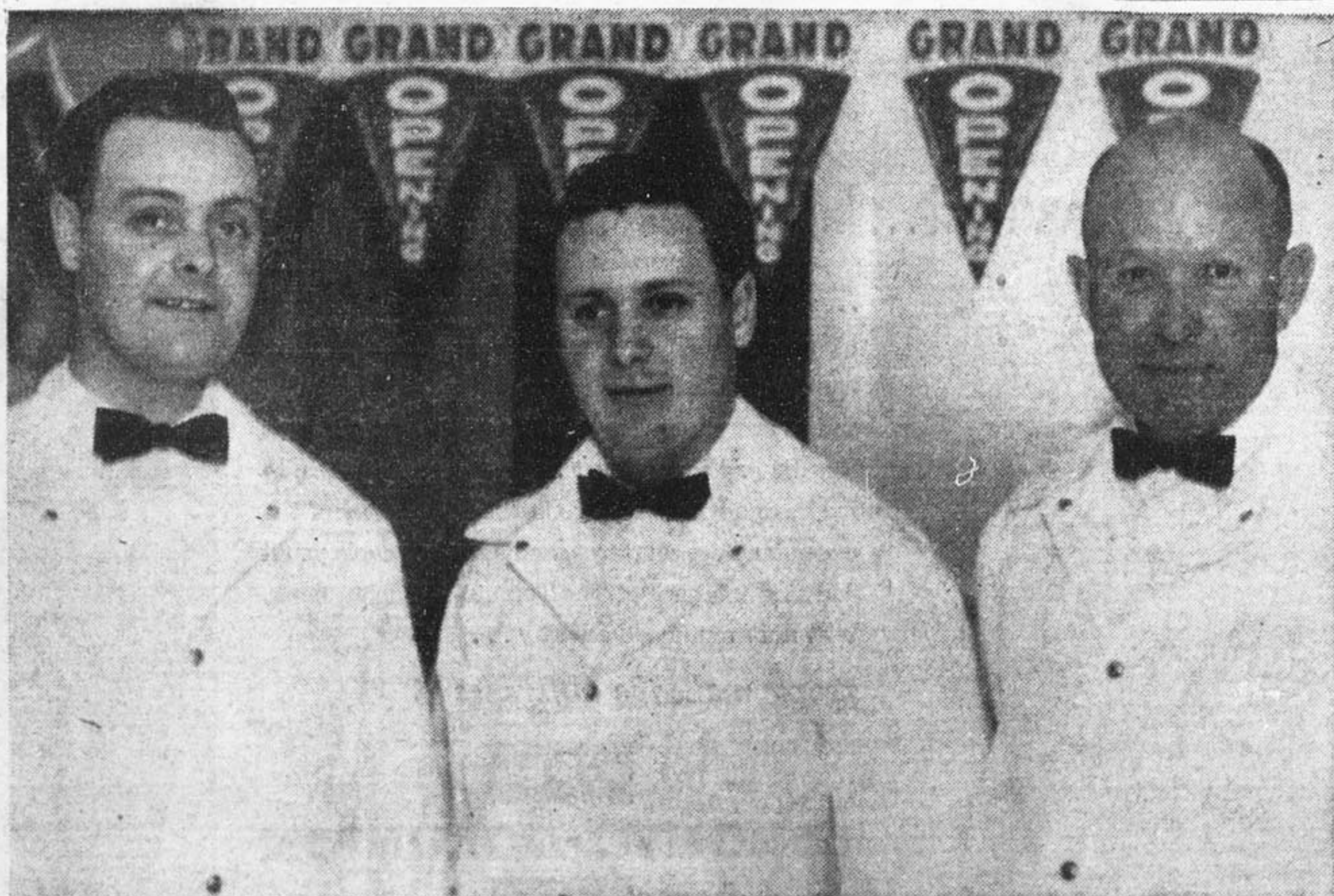
