Death of Hon. L. S. Huntington. MONTREAL, May 18.—Private dispatches were received in Toronto today announcing the death of the Hon. L. S. Huntington, Q.C. Death resulted from bronchitis. Mr. Huntington had long been suffering from this complaint, which at times oppressed him very acutely. A despatch says that Mrs. Huntington and her mother, accompanied by their son, Mr. Huntington, arrived in Montreal on Friday morning for the funeral. The funeral is to take place on Saturday. The deceased was the oldest son of the late Seth Huntington, of Waterville, Me., and was born at Compton, in May, 1827. He was twice married, his first wife having died the daughter of the late Major David Wood, of Shelburne, by whom he had three sons, none of whom survive his father. His second wife was Mrs. Mary M. Huntington, widow of the well known civil engineer of that name, by whom he had one son. He was a member of the executive council of Canada and solicitor-general of Lower Canada from May, 1853, to March, 1854, when he resigned. He was also a member of the cabinet, and in 1874 he was sworn in private councillor and was president of that body until 1875 when he was elected to the office of Minister of Public Works. He held this office until 1878. During the latter part of his life he was not in the best of health, and he died at his residence in Montreal on Friday morning. He was a man of high character and a public servant.

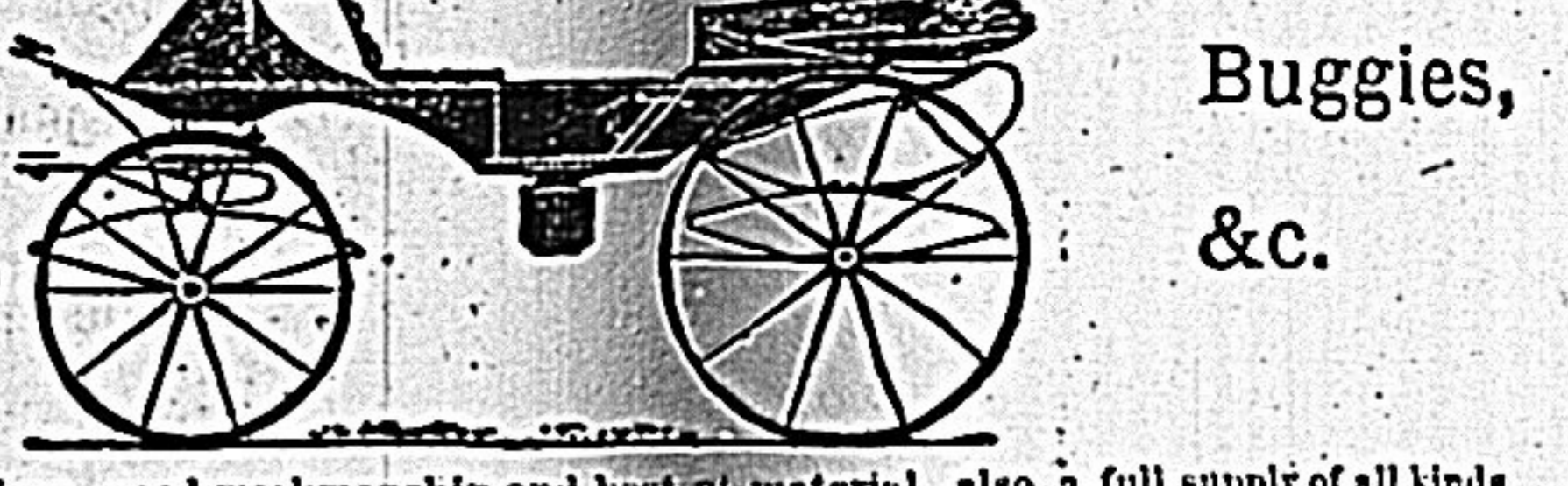
