The attempted enforcement of the Scott Act having resulted in many commotions, as it has here, in general demoralization and in failure everywhere, the so-called temperance party is now moving for some thing more stringent...

The following circular respecting the enforcement of the Canada Temperance Act has been received from the Provincial Secretary:

Cholera has appeared at Naples and Genoa. Riots, in which the police were decidedly worsted, have taken place in Genoa.

The Bulgarian regency has issued a decree convoking the National Assembly for the 15th inst. Prussia seems inclined to oppose any further extension of Russia's influence in Eastern Europe.

The Roman Catholic Bishops of Ireland have memorialized the Government for relief measures. A disease of the nature of dysteria, resembling generally in its symptoms, is decimating the Town of Avera, Iowa.

The New York hop crop is about 60 per cent. short, and the quality is exceedingly poor. Russia advises the Bulgarians to allow public opinion to calm down before proceeding to elect another Prince.

Eleven English fishing boats have been seized at Havre for infringing the fisheries laws in the British Channel. The Pope will assign Jesuits to the new episcopal sees in the East Indies created under the Portuguese Concordat.

It is stated that Prince Bismarck supports the Sultan's demand for the evacuation of Egypt by the English. Lord Anson has issued 104 ejectment notices against tenants on his estates in the County Down.

Several German spies, disguised as priests, have been arrested near Cherbourg, in France. Prince Waldemar of Denmark will be the favoured candidate for the Bulgarian throne.

Excessively hot weather killed a number of soldiers in the Asiatic army manoeuvres at Vienna. Since the outbreak of the cholera epidemic in Italy there have been 45,000 cases and 10,000 deaths from the disease throughout the country.

A dynamite cartridge was exploded at midnight on Sunday, in the principal gas way in the Maresfield Works, doing some damage.
