## THE CANADIAN CHAMPION

The Scott Act people of Halton will commence operations in the repeal campaign by a convention to-morrow, when the principal business will be organization. After the first of March perhaps some of them may come to believe that there is something in the superstition that it is unlucky to commence any undertaking on a Friday.

The CHAMPION, having advised the anti-Scott Liberal electors of Halton to support the candidate of their party on the 1st of March, was the wrath of the Standard men that their offence should have been remembered against him, and he looked about him for some one whom to vent it. He could hardly turn upon his party and its candidate even had he dared to do so, for they had punished him only by ignoring him. The CHAMPION alone had reminded him of his ill-judged attack on the candidate and had exposed his inconsistency by making quotations from it, so last week he proceeded to take it out of the CHAMPION by calling it bad names, such as "smut machine" and accusing its publishers of unworthy motives in supporting the Opposition candidate, and of having done so lest, if they did anything else, he should have taken advantage of his position as a member of the Council Council to bring about their dismissal from the county offices which they hold. The epithet "smut machine" was rather unfortunate, as the "smut" which had appeared in the CHAMPION had been merely quoted from the Standard, and the charge of mercenary motives was silly, inasmuch as even if the Opposition candidate were capable of taking the mean revenge spoken of by the author of the "smut," his party happens to be in the minority in the County Council. Under the circumstances, the CHAMPION made allowance for the slighted organist and his childish attack upon it. As long as it soothes his wounded feelings to relieve them in so harmless a way he is perfectly welcome to do so. The CHAMPION won't mind it.

ISRAEL of legislating on the amounts of Scott Act police magistrates' salaries thrown into the Ontario Government should throw the enforcement of the Act and the subsequent column back upon the Dominion Government that passed it. Under

the enforcement of the Act was made the greatest mistake ever made by the Movat Government. This

state has weakened it in many ways, especially in Halton, where partisan officials appointed to do

the work of the so-called temporary party are among the most effective

agents in the interests of the Opposition, making the Government unpopular. The trouble has been aggravated by the extraordinary neglect

of the petition sent in over six months

for the appointment of a commission to investigate the serious charges laid against Halton's notorious police magistrate.

It is hard to understand why the Government, after appointing committees in Simcoe and elsewhere, in response to similar petitions, should in this case withhold the fair play which is all that it has been asked to do.

It looks as though the gallant commanding officer of the Lorne Rifles

is popular in the House as he is in his constituency and the Government

wishes him to retain his seat as long as it can be induced and helped to keep it.

BUT the question of prohibition dominates the politics of this country. In election campaigns usually

no difficulty in stating their platforms fully and clearly, so that there is no square issue between the parties of the men.

Of late years, however, difficulties, by the tacit consent of their supporters, shirk the public discussion of this question, burning as it is, and gunboats and bolters are looked after personal canvass. The man or the woman that is most unscrupulous in promising and cleverest in the deception is the one that generates. Since the notorious D. B. Lyon first introduced the so-called "smut" into Halton, running on a Conservative interest, and in as the candidate of the liquor on the county, the grip of the liquor on the constituency has been well nigh total, now it is gone again. Whether this has been due to the cleverness of their opponents in this we have mentioned, or whether owing to the well known tendency to bolt the party ticket on issues, and the equally well known desire of Conservatives to vote the right ticket through thick and thin, nothing need be discussed here, thing is certain; as long as the ends of Halton allow the Scott Act to divide divisions among them, as it is as long as it remains in force here, they may expect the county to be represented both at Ottawa and by Conservatives. This is not only of Halton, but more or less according to one of the leading workers of Ontario, of every Act constituency in the province. The Liberals of Halton bear it in on the 1st of March and vote accordingly.

IN winter when the Government candidate in the Waldie-Henderson

had been defeated, when he supposed to be politically dead, there was nothing more to be done of him, the Dundas Standard

claimed to be the organ of the Conservative party in Halton, read a tremendous lecture in which his

was charged to his own carelessness, arrogance, and personal popularity. The tirade was appreciated by the Conservatives
