TO THE RECKONER.

SIR-Do not think it a degradation to your respectable paper, that a prodigal son requests room to make all the reparation to a world juftly offended by his conduct, that his present miserable situation admits. If fictitious stories incite to virtue, how much

more the narrations that are true.

My father, Mr. Reckoner, was a respectable merchant in London, trading to the W. Pepper, Allipice & Ginger Indies, who had no fon but your unhappy correspondent. This circumstance proved my ruin, for my parents foolifhly refolved never to contradict me. He has no brothers or fifters, they would fay, to entertain him; Cigars, and Rappee Inuff

let us not then abridge his little enjoyments with abfurd restrictions. Even the most neceffary discipline may be dispensed with, as it will be very eafy to bring him into order when his reason begins to open. By these fage refolutions, my childhood was guided; and tho' they intended to make me happy, they were far from being fuccessful. My temper became every day more and more turbulent, and was not only vexatious to all our domestics, but a continual torment to myself. Years passed rapidly away, and I had not acquired the very first elements of knowledge. The school I conceived a most intolerable reffraint, and the more odious because instead of being treated with distinction, I was exposed every hour to the most humiliating comparisons. When I contrasted these vexations with the unbounded indulgences which I received at home, I contrived numerous excuses of absence, which very eafily succeeded with my fond parents. Left entirely to myself; I became at length to troublefome that even my father began to doubt the propriety of the plan of indulgence to which he had fo rigidly adhered, but unwilling to make any alteration, he obtained my mother's content to lead me to a respect able public school in the country. He was in hopes that my distance from home and the first discipline of this celebrated seminary, would produce the most beneficial amendments. It is probable that these good confequences would have followed, had they not been prevented by an indulgence no less common than pernicious, viz. a liberal allowance of pocket money. O! Mr. Reckoner, tell your readers that if boys have money it must be expended, and if it be more than fufficient to purchase toys and sweet-meats, it will be spent to their destruction. No firiciness or attention on the part of themasters can guard against the evils which pocket money introduces. Here the parents get in opposition to the teacher, and they become the corrupters of their own children. My wealthena-

They paid with praile for the pleasures which I procured them. Having been convicted of feveral trefpalles. and private admonitions failing to produce any amendment, the rector of the school informed my father that I must be removed, or that he should be under the disagrecable neceffity of expelling me with difgrace. On my return home, my affeverations of innocence joined to plaulible fallchoods, induced my credulous parents to believe that the rector had taken a rooted diflike to me for fome trifling matters unworthy of his notice. Their fondness did not allow them to perceive that the head malter of a respectable school in England is incapable of any thing mean or unbecoming. I had by this time

my idleness in countenance, but consoled me.

my gross inattention daily exposed me .-

become a great adept in lying, for I confidered it a ufeful qualification, from the time that my excuses to flay away from my first

school succeeded so well.

I was now removed to a private academy, where I lived in perfect freedom; the mailer had become popular by his extreme indulgence-he professed to teach without punishments, and his house was filled with spoiled children. Here I learned new methods of deftroying time and fome new vices, but being now feventeen, and possessing good natural parts, I condescended to give some attention to arithmetic and accounts.
