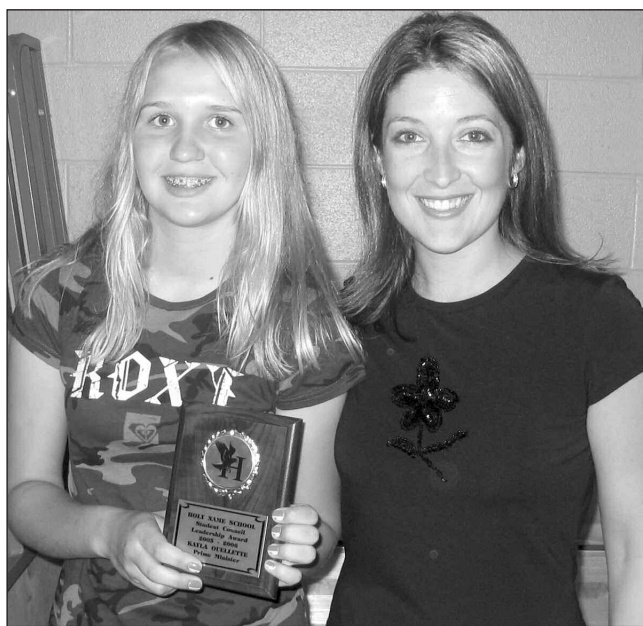


Holy Name Hawk Happenings
