Walking kits available at libraries

The Windsor Public Library, the Windsor Essex County Active Living Coalition and the Essex Public Library are inviting the public to pick up a Getting Started With Walking kit.

The kit is now available for loan at every public library branch in Windsor and Essex County. The kit contains educational and motivation instruction on how to begin regular safe physical activity.

"Most people know that physical activity is good for them; however, getting started can be difficult," a press release from the Windsor Public Library states. "Providing members of the community with free, local access to these materials is critical to their success."

According to Canada's Guide to Physical Activity, walking is considered both a light and moderate physical activity and an endurance activity that maintains the health of the heart, lungs and circulatory system. Over the long term, regular walking can help reduce the risk of certain cancers such as breast, colon, prostate and lung cancer.
