Advisory issued for pouched milk

The Windsor - Essex County Health Unit's medical officer of health has issued a dairy product advisory for pouched milk produced by Lakeside Jersey Dairy Ltd. in Leamington.

In a release dated Aug.

In a release dated Aug. 24, Dr. G. Allen Heimann said pouched milk produced by the company since Aug. 14 should be discarded. He added that milk being sold in cartons is not affected.

One sample from the line of bagged milk tested positive for the bacteria Listeria. Heimann warns that there is a possibility of other milk being contaminated. No illnesses have been reported.
