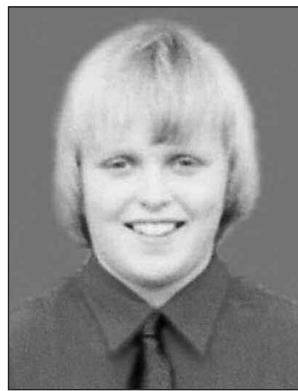

Leo Joseph Chartier passed away at Iler Lodge on September 1, 2006 at the age of 82 years. Late of Essex.

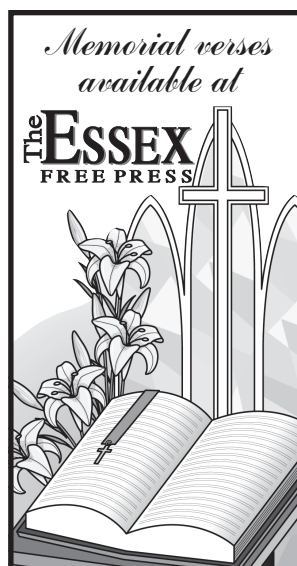

The classrooms of the past are brought to life in the newly released book *Chalk, Challenge and Change - Stories from Women Teachers in Ontario 1920-1979*.

The "as told by" stories tell about hiring and firing, struggles and celebrations, and the rewards of teaching under conditions that were often challenging ... and worlds away from the classrooms of today. Vintage photos provided by the storytellers add another dimension to the book.

The book was three and a half years in the making and was designed to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Retired Women Teachers of Ontario. All of the women who told their stories are over 90 years of age. and 200 RWTO members were interviewed for the book.
