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6. By the end of your fouryear term as mayor, what do you hope to be able to look back upon as your greatest accomplishments?

McDermott: It would be nice if I could say I was part of a team that got some industrial businesses coming in to help us and our tax base. Another thing is, I was part of the wine industry blooming to take over what Niagara Falls used to be. Colchester harbour is a jewel in the rough also. If we could only get the government to put in a little bit of money and do the things that need to be done to upgrade, then we'll take it over for them. I heard, talking after county council last week, that (Colchester) could've been like a Kingsville of Lake Erie back a lot of years ago, if the people would've had the foresight to look ahead and ask, 'Do we want it to stay the little teeny place it is, or do we want it to grow?'

Snively: I'll look back at the accomplishments of drawing light industry into our area, residential growth, drawing our two distinct communities together and

finally running under one municipality and calling ourselves the Town of Essex. I think what we have to do is finally take down this fence that divides us. When I was a mayor previously, I thought we were in the right direction. I thought that fence was down. But I have been told that the fence has gone up so high in the past three years that nobody will be able to take it down. That is a goal for me. I am going to take that fence down and finally we are going to run as one municipality. We have to.

7. How would you convince the public that Essex is "the best" place to live in Essex County?

McDermott: Just take them around. Come with me. Go to the Legion, see how the people are. Go to the post office and see how people react when they come in. Go to any of the restaurants and see the people that come from out of town and eat in our restaurants. Why are they coming here? Because of the people we have here – in business, living in the town, the people you meet on the street.

It's the hub of the county.

If you live in Essex, how long does it take you to get to any place? Half an hour, twenty minutes? It's perfect. We've got the rural area and we've got the small town atmosphere and there's nothing like living in a small town.

We have just about everything in Essex. When you have a young family and look at a town, you say, what do they have to offer? First of all, what schools do they have to offer? We go right up to high school and there's St. Clair College (nearby). Also what kind of recreation facilities do they have? Do they have everything that my kids are going to want? In Essex, we're pretty close to having all these things.

Snively: We have a lot to offer. If you take a look at the south end, we have the most beautiful area. Hopefully it's going to be developed. In Colchester we have the marina, the wine industry that is rapidly developing. In the former town of Essex we have the Highway 3 by-pass. We can attract light industry and a lot of residential growth in the Town of Essex.
