Royal Canadian Legion Branch 201 held their annual Remembrance Day banquet this past Sunday in Essex. A full house came out to hear various speakers pay tribute to Canada's military in past and present conflicts.

Essex MPP Bruce Crozier noted that it's the "young who will carry the message (of remembrance) forward." Kim Morris, president of Branch 201's Ladies Auxiliary, presented the branch with a \$20,000 donation, generated by volunteers at the Legion kitchen.

Padre Kim Gilliland presented a slide show of his trip to European battlefields this year. Beautifully landscaped cemeteries, described as English gardens, dot the countryside at all too familiar locations like Dieppe. He noted that while most World War Two graves are identified, most Great War sites are not. Vimy Ridge, where author Pierre Berton once said that "Canada became a nation", still contains live munitions and expels about 60 bodies from the ground per year.

Legion services will be held at Essex United Church at 10 a.m. Nov. 11, followed by a service at the Cenotaph at 11 a.m.
