# Red Raider girls take WECSSAA basketball championship

The Essex High School Junior Girls' basketball team got their wish Sunday afternoon—a chance to play for the WECSSAA AAA/ championship AAAA against perennial superpower St. Anne's Saints.

Hoping to atone for their only regular season loss - a mid-October 39-30 defeat at the hands of the Saints – the Essex girls responded with their best effort of the season cruising to a 43-26 win before a raucous crowd of staff, student and parent supporters at the St. Clair College gym.

The Red Raiders arrived pumped and ready to prove that, in spite of being the underdogs, they were determined to take the game to St. Anne's right from the opening tip-off. Led by balanced scoring from forwards Cortney Johnston (13 points), Laura Chittle (12 points) and guard Amy Bjorkman (11 points), the Raiders took an early lead that they never relinquished.

Raider guard Kelsey Balkwill put on her usual show of excellent defensive persistence while running the offence like a pro. Centre Jill Lappan contributed with fine defensive play and timely rebounding.

Head coach Dave Harrison was very happy with the team's overall effort.

"You can't expect to beat a really good team like St. Anne's unless everyone contributes and stays focused on the little things," Harrison explained. "Today our girls did just that. They should be as proud of themselves as the coaches and parents are of them."

Assistant coach Kathy Corchis was impressed by the team's poise under pres-
