He'd like to slightly improve his time in the 50metre freestyle event to give him a better shot during the Canadian Olympic trials held in Montreal in April.

His competition time for the 50-yard freestyle was just over 22 seconds. He'd like to shave off about 1/1000 of a second.

"That's nothing," he said. "That's a matter of growing my fingernails."

Pinsonneault has competed in such meets as the Canadian Nationals, the Canadian Provincials and qualified for the NAIA Division 1 Swimming Nationals in

He received a swimming scholarship to Union College after his first year in school at Seneca College in Toronto. He has worked with Olympic coaches and says he is currently training hard for the Montreal trials.
