Land shortages and infrastructure challenges worry Ontario home builders

Ontario home builders predict dwindling land supplies and increases in land costs will be a significant barrier to efforts by the provincial government to implement its "Places to Grow" growth plan.

In a recent Ontario Builders' Association survey of its builder members, over 35 percent cited land supply worries as a major problem and almost 40 percent said land costs and availability are the biggest barriers to building affordable housing in Ontario.


"It's an uphill battle trying to maintain new home affordability," noted Brian Johnston, president of "Unfortunately, provincial legislation designed to speed up and simplify the residential building process isn't working as it was intended and that's leading to frustration and costly delays."

Another major issue is infrastructure challenges. The relatively fast pace of

growth in the province has left some areas without adequate roads, transit and

residential services. Over 60 percent of builders surveyed expect new home starts to decrease in 2007 compared to 2006. OHBA is forecasting 69,000 housing starts for 2007 compared to the 75,000 starts anticipated this year. Ontarians are projected to spend about \$17 billion on home repair and renovations in 2007.
