73's coaches face year-long suspensions

Essex 73's head coach/ general manager Tony Piroski and assistant coach Lee Jones are facing yearlong suspension for a verbal confrontation with a referee in November.

Following a 4-3 overtime loss to the Wallaceburg Lakers Nov. 14, the coaches were involved in a "shouting match" with referee Ryan Renaud in the hallway, Jones said.

Jones said the confrontation was the result of a number of penalty calls Renaud made against the 73's that they felt were unwarranted.

Jones said the coaches became involved "in the

heat of the moment," but maintains that the argument didn't get physical.

Following the incident, the coaches were each handed seven game suspensions.

"What we did was wrong," Jones said. "That's why we didn't appeal the first suspension."

On Friday, the Ontario Hockey Association handed down a supplementary oneyear suspension to both coaches. They have filed appeals and will soon meet with an OHA appeal committee that will decide

whether to vary or uphold the suspensions.

They are being charged with gross misconduct and abuse of an official.

OHA president Brent Ladds said a decision on the suspension term reached after consultations with Piroski, Jones, Renaud and the game's two linesmen, Mike Aubin and Jeff Weglarz.

Ladds said the suspension would carry over into next season and be in effect until November 14, 2007.

Jones said he considers the suspension "very harsh" and that he was expecting it to last only a few games.

Piroski was unavailable for comment.


