Canadiens embarrass 73's at home

If you are a Belle River Canadiens fan, you probably felt delight in last Tuesday's game at Essex Memorial Arena, as the visiting Canadiens handed the Essex 73's some of their own medicine - defeat. Belle River showed no mercy as they soundly beat Essex by a 5-0 score.

"We knew this has been coming for a while," veteran player Chad Wolters

Captain Rob Shepley summed it up best. "We knew we have not been playing well as well as we should be the last four or five outings, and we certainly didn't need to lose to

The first period was all Canadiens, as they continually beat the 73's to the puck, and out-hustled them throughout the period. The hard work paid off for the visitors as they jumped out to a 3-0 lead.

The locals must have received a tongue lashing between periods as they

came out strong in period two, but ran into a problem named Dan Eichel. The Belle River goaltender played solid in keeping the 73's off the score sheet.

The visitors added a bit of salt to the wound by cashing in on a power play late in the period.

But the Canadiens were

not done quite yet. They added a shorthanded marker late in period three for the shutout.

"Belle River out-battled us, and they deserved to win," said Wolters. "I hope this is an eye opener for us, especially the first year players. This is reminiscent of a couple of years ago when we could not put the puck in the net, and were eliminated by Dresden. We have to find a way to put the puck in the net."

"I hope a game like this will build character for the team," Shepley said.

With only two weeks remaining in the regular season, Essex will play just once this week when the Wheatley Sharks invade the Essex Arena on Tuesday.

Rather, he feels the OHA is emphasizing its "zero tolerance" policy for coaches who verbally confront an official.

"It's perplexing," Byrne said. "There were no threats or physical conduct. This was simply a disagreement."

Byrne said a shorter suspension term would have been acceptable, but one that spills over into the next season and causes Piroski to miss a 73's playoffs run is "very heavy."

"My interpretation is that they've thrown everything into a pot and painted over it with a broad brush," Byrne said. "I think there are altercations every day in hockey...This moves us to a whole new level that even having a discussion with a referee can result in a punishment this severe. This is groundbreaking stuff."

Byrne said the appeals committee is suggesting that coaches register any complaints they may have to the OHA office in Cambridge.

"It seems curious that for every little issue that arises they expect people to take it to Cambridge," Byrne said. "Whatever happened to local decision making?"

Byrne said he is concerned that the appeal committee's decision will dampen some people's enthusiasm about volunteering to coach and work with young athletes.

Karen Phibbs, a member of the appeal board, refused to comment when asked about the board's reasons behind handing down the one-year suspension, saying "it is innappropriate" to make public the information because it could affect any future appeal.
