The tower is expected to be completed soon, depending on weather conditions, Stefansson said.

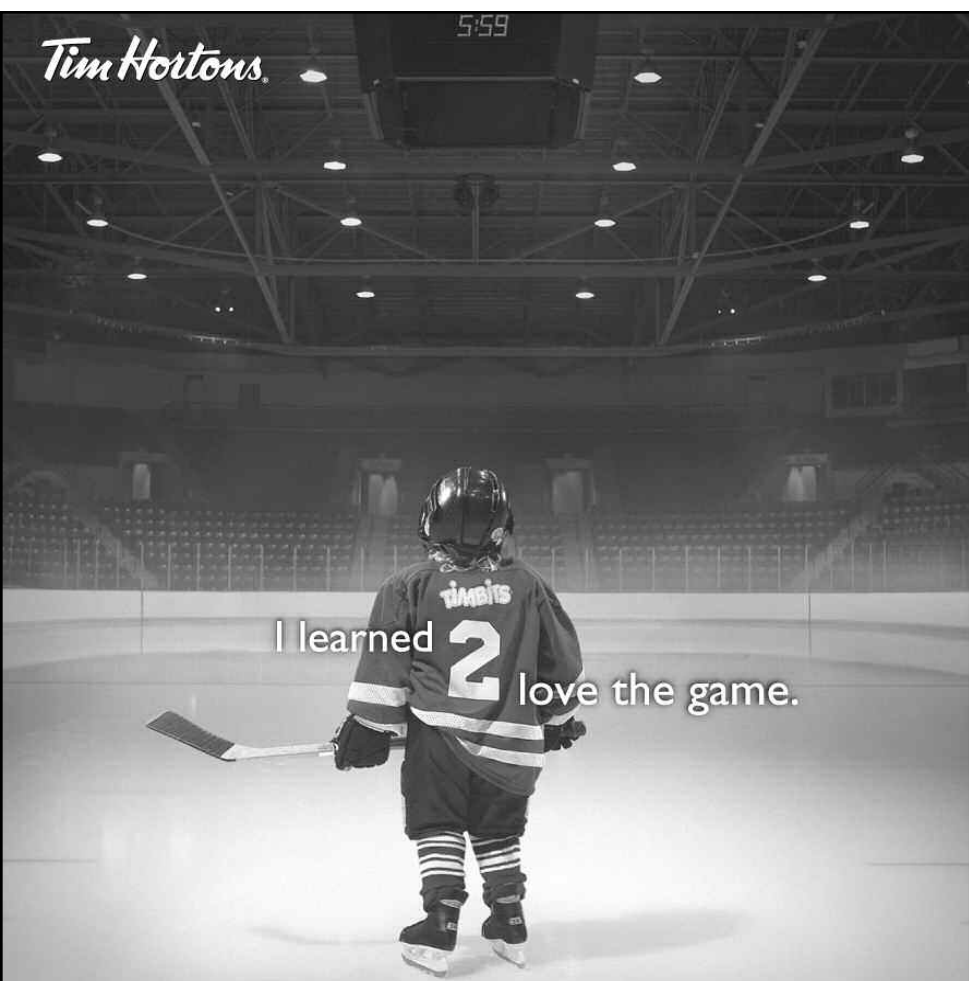
New Harrow doctor
