"We want to honour those who have given their lives and those who've come back and pressed on," said guest speaker Larry Costello, a veteran of the Second World War. "As a veteran, I find it an honour and a privilege to be asked to salute them."

Debbie said ever since the death of Sgt. Donald Lucas, a friend of the family and one of six soldiers who were killed in a roadside bombing on Easter Sunday, Duane has said his sense of duty has only strengthened.

"He said they have a job to do and all the guys want to be there," Debbie said. "After Donny died, they don't want him to die for nothing."
