When the branch first opened for business here on November 17, 1898 none of Oakville's streets were paved, and after a fall of rain, they quickly became quagmires of mud.

Oakville's population in 1898 was only about 1,700 people and its economy was largely based on the importance of the town as the centre of a fruit farming district.

So it was that the bank initially an office of the merchants bank of Canada, long since part of the B of M- dealt largely with business connected with the fruit industry.

In the 80 years since then, the bank has played its part in the development of Oakville into the town as we know it today — a desirable residential community in the heart of Ontario's most highly industrialized area.
