HMCS NIPIGON PROGRAMME



Final plans are being laid for the visit of the Helicopter Destroyer HMCS Nipigon. The ship is 366' long and carries over 300 men. It is hoped that the helicopter "Sea King" will be on board during the visit but this may not be possible. The public is invited to visit the ship on the following schedule:

Saturday, August 19th, 3:30 pm - 4 pm.
6:30 pm - 8 pm.
Sunday, August 20th, 3:30 pm - 4 pm.
6:30 pm - 8 pm.

Visitors are asked to use the lower gate on Baker Road. Parking accommodations will be available on Duntar property. Special groups (i.e. Sea Cadets etc.) can arrange tours on Saturday and Sunday Mornings from 9:30 - 11:30 am.

C. O. HMCS NIPIGON

Commander Carling, 42, born and educated in Ottawa, Ontario, entered the Navy as a Seaman in February 1943. He was commissioned in 1944 and during the Second World War served in the escort TILLAMUNG on convoy duty in the North Atlantic. He subsequently served in the escort aircraft carrier Funcher, the Destroyer Inopoli and the minesweeper New Labrador.

In May 1948 Commander Carling was attached to the Royal Navy where he served in the cutter SWIFBISE in the Pacific and in the destroyer CREOLE which was assigned to the Joint Anti-Submarine School at Londonderry, Northern Ireland.

He returned to Canada in autumn 1947 and in January 1948 commenced a specialist course in communications from which he graduated the following November. During the period 1949 to 1952 he served in this specialist capacity at Naval Headquarters Ottawa and on the staff of the Flag Officer

INVESTIGATIONS

THEFT
