DURHAM, OCTOBER 26, 1860. Owing to a series of uncontrollable mishaps we are this week obliged to issue only a half sheet.

"There's something rotten in the state of Denmark."

"Law makers should not be law breakers," is an old saying, and a true one. We are sorry to state that this good old adage has been entirely forgotten by the members of our County Council; for we are informed on the best authority that both Reeves and Deputy Reeves of said Council are employed as inspectors on our County Gravel Roads; and most of them know no more about road-making than the Man in the Moon. But with their knowledge we have nothing to do, for even if they had the necessary qualifications, we argue they have no right to be employed; and are by the Statutes of the country, disqualified.

The Municipal Law says, "no persons receiving any allowance from the municipality, or persons, having by hire self or partner any interest in any contract, shall be qualified to be, or be, elected Alderman or Councillor." This is very plain language, and cannot be easily misunderstood. We would have thought that the members of the County Council would have profited by the lesson they received last year, when the By-Law allowing mileage to Councillors was declared by the Judge to be illegal, it being made in opposition to the Statute Law. But it seems they have not profited by past experience, or they would not have employed and paid members of the Corporation for inspectors of County Roads.—Admit the principle of Councillors employing themselves, and we may bid adieu to justice, and our purses into the bargain.
