MINING LOCATIONS.

DEPARTMENT OF CROWN LANDS. Quebec, 21st April, 1862. THE following changes in the mode of disposing of Mining Locations have been authorized by His Excellency the Governor General in Council: That in all future sales of Mineral Lands a Royalty of 2 1/2 per cent on all ore extracted be payable in cash on the value of the ore prepared for market at the mine, and that Letters Patent be issued for such lands on the payment of the purchase money without any additional conditions; also that Lots in surveyed townships, presenting indications of Minerals, be sold at the same price per acre as the lands adjacent, subject to the above mentioned Royalty. 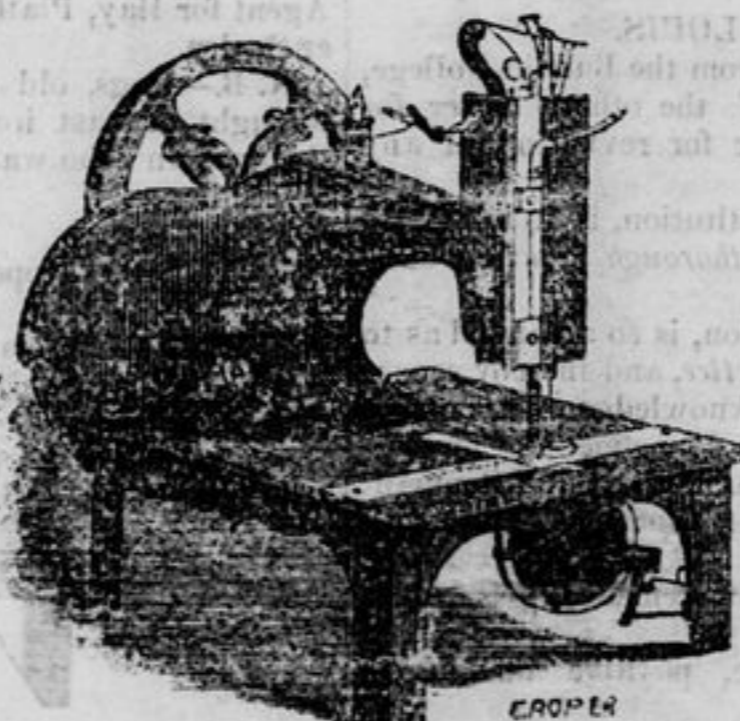
