That Lots number six to twenty-eight inclusive, on the Ninth Concession, be taken from Centre Ward and added to North Ward; and that the Second Concesssion North of the Durham Read, from Lot number ten to the Town-line of Artemesia, be taken from Centre Ward and added to South Ward; and Lots number one to ten inclusive on the First Concession North of the Durham Road, be taken from South Ward and aided to Durham Ward.


