

DELICIOUS WINTER DISH

Sometimes something is desired which is a little more elaborate than the ordinary every-day bill of fare affords...

For two dozen large oysters make a force-meat with the following ingredients: The breast of an uncooked fowl, chopped, pounded and then rubbed through a sieve...

Put the bread and cream in a small saucepan and cook until a smooth paste is formed (it will take two minutes on the back of the range where it should be put and where it will hardly bubble).

Dry the oysters on a soft towel and season them with salt and pepper. Now roll them in fine bread crumbs and lay them on a large dish. Divide the forcemeat into twelve parts and spread evenly on twelve oysters.

Put into a deep plate the yolk of the egg left from the forcemeat and one whole egg and beat well with a fork. Season with salt. Dip the stuffed oysters in this egg and then roll them in bread crumbs, being careful to have them part covered with the egg and crumbs.
