THE LARGEST SPECTROSCOPE.

Madgeburg, Germany, is to have the largest spectroscope ever built. It is to be the property of Dr. Hans Hauswaldt, a rich scientist of that place, scientific instruments, of Alleghany, the supply on hand. Penn., is the maker of this gigantice piece of work. 




