The following letter from Mr. M W. Doherty, of the Ontario Agricultural College, was received in answer to Mr. Gorsline's enquiry about very rare, but very noxious weed recently discovered and submitted for identification. Farmers in the vicinity who imported hay two or three years ago had better examine their fields as it must have been admitted in that way. The letter is dated at Guelph, July 11th. '99, and reads as follows:

DEAR SIR,—Your specimen addressed to Prof. Hutt was handed to me yesterday. to its great development of root, it is almost impossible to eradicate it in a short time I would advise you to summer-fallow, plowing the weeds under when in flower. Follow with Rape or Buckwheat sewed the following summer about as late as possible. Plow ginning active development work. just before sowing the crop. If possible follow the next year with some hoed crop. This is somewhat of a severe treatment, but I think the nature of the weed warrants
