CHANGED HANDS.—The building now occupied as a foundry and machine shop by Mr. Charter Smith, has this week been purchased by Mr. D. Campbell and will be converted into a lively stable. Mr. Smith will re-fit the old Cochrane foundry, which he owns and will conduct his business there shortly. Fortunately however, Mr. Hazlett soon came along and assisted the ladies into the rig when they were driven home.
