

MISS BRACKBILL, who has been laboring as a missionery in China about two thousand miles west of Shanghai, delivered an interesting address on her work there, in the Methodist Church on Sunday evening. Made for ease and grace Without any effort at oratorical frills, she took the audience with her in an imaginary trip across the Pacific from Vancouver to Shanghai, thence by steamer and "house boats' up the Yang-tse-Kiang to the head of navigation. The filth of Chinese cities, the speaker claimed. shows an entire lack of the knowledge and importance of all sanitary requirements. The cities are surrounded by stone walls, about 40 feet high, perpendicular on the outside, but sloping so that the tops are easily accessible from the inside.
