 standard rules.

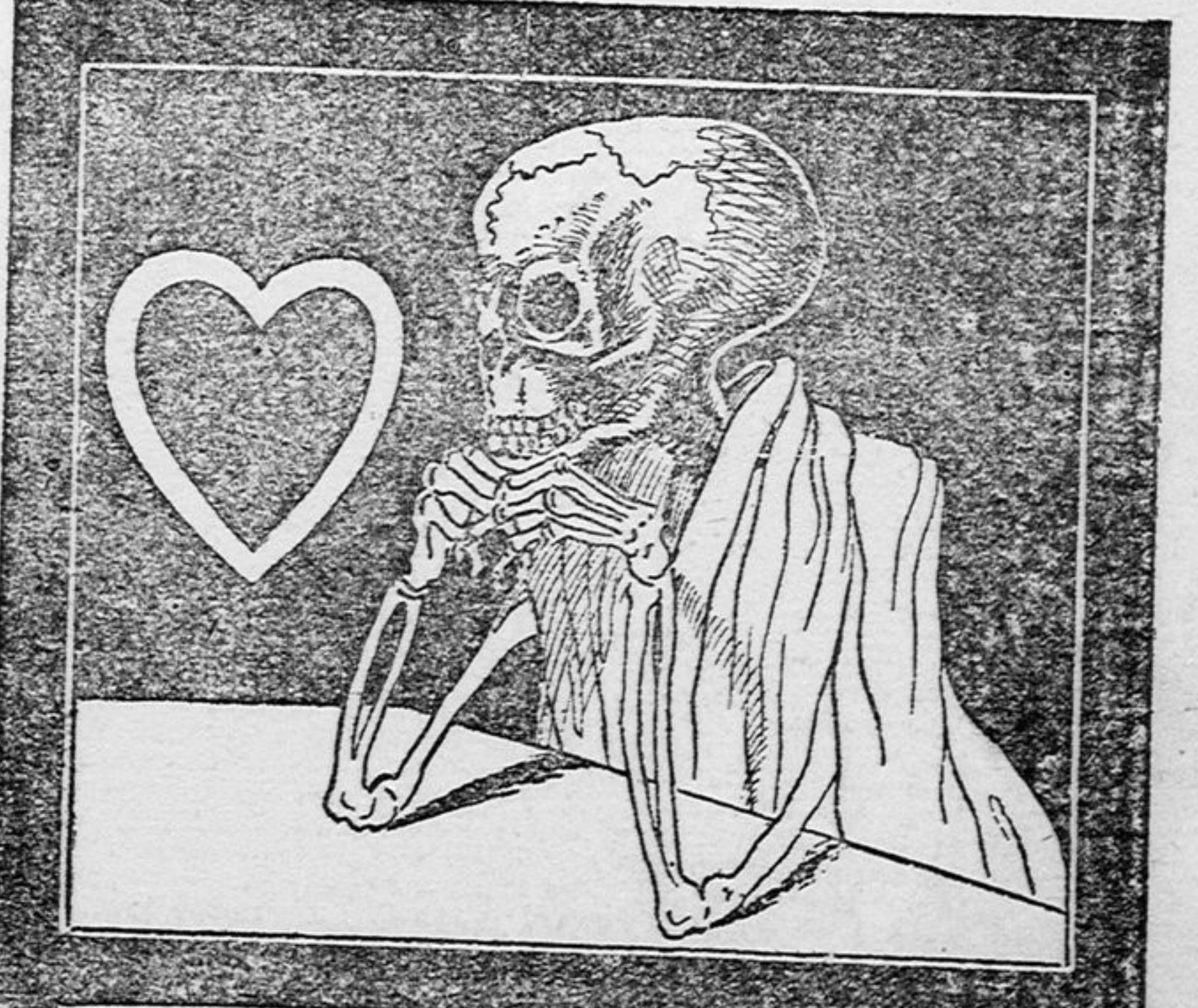
The Frost & Wood Machinery
