## ARTEMESIA FAIR.

QUEENS WEATHER AND A BIG CROWD.

The Artemesia Agricultural Society held their Annual Fair on Wednesday and Thursday of last week. The weather was all that could be desired and it must be gratifying to the Directors and Society generally to see the interest taken in their township show.

The exhibits were on the whole, good. The fruit and roots were, we believe, better than any show at the surrounding fairs. Messrs. J. I. Graham and Jas. Brodie had fine collections of fruit, the former making a specialty of fruit growing. In pears, however, the prize went to John Eckhardt of Glenelg.

Some very good cattle, sheep and pigs, were shown but the poultry was not very well up.

Some of the exhibitors and especially Secretaries were very anxious to tell us that Priceville was the best number and the best colts shown anywhere round this section.

In the evening an entertainment was given in Watson's Hall when the Kinetoscope was used to exhibit Views of the Spanish American War. The attendance was good and much enjoyed by those who were present.
